HUD Chief Says Riots May Slow Ghetto Aid

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—The nation's lone Negro cabinet member fears that recent riots may bring a slowdown in programs needed to solve the problems of the ghetto.
But Robert C. Weaver, HUD secretary, said that all assistance programs must be "decided and committed" to solve these problems.
Weaver said Americans must resolve the problem of equal access to housing for all.
This is primarily a matter of morality, but it is also, in part, a matter of money and legislation. Weaver told the Negro real estate group.
The housing industry suffers a hardship because when housing is not open to "all who are needed it, investors and builders are not able to supply what is needed and where it is needed.
Weaver said only 15 million housing units are covered by federal non-discrimination requirements, thus leaving more than 40 million not covered.
He said the nation has taken some meaningful steps to aid its cities.

Unionist: Negroes' Rebellion Like 30's

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—The current rebellion which has led to rioting is "not a bit different than the 1930s when the working people rebelled against injustice," according to a top international convention Monday that labor's objective today must be to "achieve for Negroes in the 1960s what unions achieved for workers in the 1930s."
Fitzgerald, in a keynote address to 400 representatives of the 165,000 member union, linked America's failure to meet the problems of the ghetto with our policy of pouring billions into Vietnam and into a "mad race to the moon."
